

Fracking, Energy Policy Fight Looms Over Harris, Trump Campaigns in Pennsylvania

It has been more than a month ago that Vice President Kamala Harris stated that she no longer favored a [ban on fracking](#) – a key issue in Pennsylvania and a must-win state for the presidential candidate.

Frank Maisano, of Bracewell's Policy Resolution Group, told the *Pittsburgh Post-Gazette* that the Biden administration has been inconsistent on energy policy. He noted that the administration is trying “to serve two masters ... a group of progressives who are demanding that they do everything that they want them to do ... that does not match up with the energy demands in the country ... especially in places like western Pennsylvania.”

The Keystone State is the second-largest producer of natural gas in the country and a state that President Joe Biden narrowly won four years ago in part by appealing to both environmentalists and union energy workers.
